PROGRAM INFORMATION-Advance Now 2015-2016

*Program & Course offerings are subject to change due to low enrollments at the discretion of Rock Valley College.

*Programs are offered to Juniors and Seniors; with most programs giving priority to Juniors.

*The attached program spreadsheet has been provided by RVC-HSC. It includes all programs and available information.

*Specific program questions may be directed to HSC.

Program Costs:

- Students may be responsible for a portion of the tuition, program fees, supplies and materials; student cost will be determined by and at the discretion of each of our 10 school districts with the use of a district developed and district enforced, contract.
- At this time, final costs have not yet been determined by Rock Valley College; upon release to CEANCI, costs will be submitted to our *district business managers and school counselors*.
- CEANCI will continue to invoice program costs to our school districts for students enrolled in Advance Now programs.
- CEANCI is not allowed to reimburse school districts or students for program costs.

District-Based Contracts:

- CEANCI continues to encourage, with the support of district business managers, district-based contracts for all students enrolled in Advance Now programs; instilling a vested interest and commitment as well as financial responsibility should a student or parent request withdrawal from the enrolled program.

Requests for Withdrawal:

- CEANCI does not advocate or support student withdrawal requests; however, we realize circumstances determined by and supported by the student's school counselor and school district business manager, in cooperation with the student's parents or guardians, will require CEANCI and RVC-HSC to proceed with a requested withdrawal from the enrolled Advance Now program.
- If a withdrawal request is made by a student and/or a school district staff member:
 1. CEANCI has been directed to notify the student's district business manager of the withdrawal request, to ensure they have been made aware; as districts incur all or a portion of program costs.
 2. Students are *not allowed to withdraw from any one course* within an Advance Now program; the student must withdraw from ALL courses and discontinue their program.
 3. CEANCI is not allowed to reimburse any portion of program costs to the school district or student.

Prerequisite for Advance Now Applicants/Online Courses:

- Earn a 70 on the Reading Portion of the ACCUPLACER; however, all students will be tested in Reading, English and Math; providing the data necessary to develop college readiness interventions as requested by school districts.
- *Additional* testing & program prerequisites are indicated in the attached program spreadsheet provided by RVC-HSC.

Online Courses:

- Please refer to the attached 'Online Course Offerings.'
- Students may only enroll in one course per semester.
- All on-line courses are available in the Fall Semester and in the Spring Semester.
- College credit is provided for online courses; we ask our high schools to ensure high school credit will be provided for online courses allowing students to earn 'dual credit.'
- Due to the nature of self-paced, self-managed on-line courses, student applications must receive signature approval from parents, counselors and their building principals.
- RVC's online Learning Management System is CANVAS (EAGLE).
- An 'Online EAGLE Orientation,' provided by RVC-HSC, will help each student prepare for the online course experience.
- Online students must follow all Advance Now protocol, procedures and expectations, unless otherwise noted.
- Online students must attend the Advance Now Orientation scheduled in August of 2015.

- School counselors are also asked to provide district-based contracts, at the above meeting time.
- School counselors are asked to make the necessary changes to student's schedules to accommodate the Advance Now schedule indicated.
- When determined by Rock Valley College and provided to school districts; school counselors will provide student program cost for Advance Now programs, per district based contract.
- Non-accepted students may be contacted by RVC-HSC about additional dual credit or college readiness opportunities.

Final Day to Withdraw from an Advance Now Program

Special Notes:

- April 24th represents the deadline to withdraw with no financial obligation to districts or students.
- District developed and enforced contracts, encouraged by CEANCI, will include the financial obligation determined by the student's school district, for students withdrawing from Advance Now after April 24, 2015.
- CEANCI is not allowed to reimburse school districts or students for program costs.
